

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Shared Call for T32 Nominations: Developmental Biology; Computational Genomics; Cell and Molecular Biology; and Genetics

The following training grants are soliciting nominations of graduate students for the 2019-2020 academic year through a BGS-managed web-based system. Training grants fund a significant portion of a student's tuition, fees, and stipend. Appointment to a training grant is recognition of academic promise and distinction and, in some cases, provides additional training opportunities or funds for travel to scientific meetings. To be eligible for consideration, a student must be a US citizen or permanent resident (green card holder) and must have received no more than four years of NRSA funding by the time of appointment. Additional criteria for each grant are specified in the <u>descriptions available here</u>.

Opportunities for students who will have reached dissertation level - May 1 deadline: Developmental Biology Computational Genomics

Opportunities for students who are entering year two (or sometimes three) - June 7 deadline: Cell and Molecular Biology Genetics

Symposium in Honor of P. Leslie Dutton

One of the PSOM's most distinguished faculty members, **P. Leslie Dutton**, FRS, Eldridge Reeves Johnson Professor of Biophysics and Biochemistry, is retiring. Leslie is a former chair of the B&B department, and a former chair of the Biophysics Graduate Group (before BC and BP merged). There will be a scientific symposium in his honor, **Friday, May 31st – Saturday, June 1st.**

More than 25 PhD students graduated from Leslie's lab, from 1978 onwards, and almost ALL of them will be at the symposium! About 10 of them will be speaking. These alumni have gone on to successful careers in **academia, industry, gov. research. consulting etc.**, so this would be a unique opportunity for BGS students to see and meet them. The symposium is open to everyone, and there are also two breakfasts which would provide opportunities for students to meet and talk informally with these alumni.

ITMAT Education – TL1/T32 Slots Available for Certificate in Regulatory Science

Deadline: May 17, 2019

ITMAT Education's Certificate in Regulatory Science provides PhD students with training to build upon their scientific expertise and prepares them to understand regulatory strategy, the execution of clinical trials, and approaches to translate early discoveries and preclinical investigations into therapeutics. This program is designed for PhD students who wish to pursue regulatory science careers in academia, the pharmaceutical & biotechnology industry, consulting and legal industries, and federal agencies.

The certificate includes a one-year engagement in a regulatory science research project (a new research project or as an additional aim to research currently being conducted) and four courses. TL1 appointees will receive one year of funding including a stipend per NIH policy and tuition funding to cover the cost of the certificate.

ARL Distinguished Postdoctoral Fellowship Program Research Funding

The Army Research Laboratory (ARL) invites exceptional young researchers to apply for an <u>ARL</u> <u>Distinguished Postdoctoral Fellowship</u> (www.nas.edu/arl). This fellowship provides recipients the opportunity to pursue independent research while working alongside some of the nation's best scientists and engineers. Applicants must display extraordinary ability in scientific research and show clear promise of becoming outstanding leaders. Successful candidates will have already tackled a major scientific or engineering problem or will have provided a new approach or insight, evidenced by a recognized impact in their field.

The fellowship includes an annual stipend of \$100,000, among other benefits. *Applicants who intend to defend their dissertation after the application deadline* (May 31st, 5 PM Eastern Standard Time) are not eligible. See more details here.
