

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Reminder: Your IDP Is Due August 15th

This is a reminder that your IDP is due August 15th. The more thoughtfully you complete the form, the more helpful you will find the process.

- Set aside an hour or more to consider the questions before answering.
- Many students find it quite useful to review last year's IDP (if you had filed one).
- 1. Download the fillable PDF form at http://www.med.upenn.edu/bgs/idp.shtml.

2. The first few sections ask about your research, a self-assessment of skills, and your career development.

3. A section listing "Achievements" (section 4) is to be completed online (a link is provided in the IDP).

4. The "Action Plan": Once you have addressed the questions in the above sections, send the first three to your advisor, and set a time to meet to discuss this year's IDP. Together, you will develop an

"Action Plan" (the last section of the IDP). By all means, include your Advisory committee in this process.

PENN GENETICS AWARDS | Kadesch Prize & Kaushal Awards | Applications Due 8/21/20

The **KADESCH PRIZE** is open to senior students or recent graduates from any Biomedical Graduate Studies graduate group.

To apply, submit:

- CV with publications (published or in press only!)
- 350 word summary of research project, emphasizing big picture significance
- 350 word summary of teaching, mentorship, and community service activities undertaken during graduate career
- Letter from thesis advisor

The **KAUSHAL AWARD** is open to BGS students and PSOM Postdocs. Applicants may nominate one of their publications, on which they are a first author or co-first author, from the current or prior academic year (after 7/1/19), that is related to any aspect of Genetics.

To apply, submit:

- Full citation for the publication being nominated
- 350-word summary describing, in lay terms, the publication's big picture significance, and the role that the first author played in the work (written by the first author, and signed by both the first author and their mentor)
