

# **Prism & MATLAB Sign-Up Forms**

BGS students may obtain one year licenses for Prism and MATLAB free of charge. Sign-up forms for each are below. Note that **FORMS ARE DUE by MARCH 20th**.

## 1) PRISM LICENSES

These are arranged through BGS. The new license year begins May 1st. **Please note that even if** you already have a **Prism license you need to sign up again.** You will not need to install the software again but may be prompted to update to the latest Prism version in order to extend your license for another year.

Note that BGS offers Prism particularly for its graphing capabilities. With respect to statistical applications, we remind students of the importance of understanding the fundamental properties of any statistical analyses that they undertake. In addition, principles of reproducible research require all analyses to be carefully documented. This involves storing the data in an accessible form and creating a written record so that another researcher can easily replicate the statistical analyses for a particular set of data.

## 2) MATLAB LICENSES

## **HTRS Student Research Award Applications Now Open**

Applications are now open for the **2020 HTRS Student Research Awards (SRA)**, an 8- to 10-week program for medical, PhD, MD/PhD, or PharmD students working on targeted research projects in hemostasis and thrombosis. Proposed projects may be lab-based, clinical or epidemiologic in design. The program includes a \$5,000 award stipend plus a \$2,000 travel allowance, collaboration with a research mentor, and a presentation at a 2021 professional meeting. # ITMAT Education – TL1/T32 Slots Available for Certificate in Regulatory Science

Deadline: March 6, 2020

ITMAT Education's Certificate in Regulatory Science provides PhD students with training to build upon their scientific expertise and prepares them to understand regulatory strategy, the execution of clinical trials, and approaches to translate early discoveries and preclinical investigations into therapeutics. This program is designed for PhD students who wish to pursue regulatory science

careers in academia, the pharmaceutical & biotechnology industry, consulting and legal industries, and federal agencies.

The certificate includes a one-year engagement in a regulatory science research project (a new research project or as an additional aim to research currently being conducted) and four courses. Research Tea with Dr. Nalaka Gooneratne on Leveraging University Resources to Create an Open Education On-Line Resource

Did you know that the University of Pennsylvania has a plethora of powerful, no-cost resources that can allow you to epublish your book, journal or other academic work? In this session, we will discuss how a team from Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the Institute for Translational Medicine and Therapeutics at the Perelman School of Medicine were able to do just that and put together a 550 page book on the topic of Academic Entrepreneurship for Medical and Health Scientists, a first-of-its-kind textbook that seeks to accelerate the development and translation of new scientific discoveries into the world of patient care.

Dr. Gooneratne is Associate Professor of Medicine at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. His research expertise crosses a range of specialties and methods including: aging, sleep, complementary/alternative medicine, melatonin, patient-oriented research, translational research, categorical data, clinical trials, multivariate analysis, time series.
