

Support for BGS Students and BPP Postdocs Regarding Violence and Anti-Asian Hate Incidents

We would like to add our voices to those of others on campus and in the Perelman School of Medicine, as well as the those of the student leaders of the BGS Peer Support Network (see those messages and lists of resources here). Many of you are non-US citizens or first-generation students who have had to face significant challenges to come to graduate school or postdoctoral training at Penn, and we are horrified that so many of you have been directly targeted and harassed on the basis of your race over the past year. Last week's murders in Atlanta underscore the dangers of being non-white in our country, and we share in your grief and dismay.

BGS students represent 36 countries beyond the US, reflecting a great richness of heritages and experiences -- a richness that is reflected among many of our US-born students as well. Our post-doctoral fellows reflect a similar richness and diversity. We are deeply honored to bring together trainees with a broad range of cultural, racial, and ethnic backgrounds, and we appreciate that the diversity you bring makes us better as a community and as individuals.

We want you to know that we are committed to your health and safety, and we urge you to participate in <u>Flatten the Hate</u> and to take advantage of Penn support systems, including the <u>Peer Support Network</u>. Please do not hesitate to reach out to us or to your graduate group advisors with any needs you may have.

COVID-19 Testing and Vaccinations

Testing. Graduate students who live on campus or come to campus each week must be tested. You may enroll in Penn Cares Testing or in COVID SAFE – but you should not be enrolled in both simultaneously. If you are working in a lab in CHOP, Wistar, or another affiliate and are NOT entering Penn/PSOM buildings, you should follow those entities' testing protocols and do NOT need to enroll in University testing. You may receive automated emails about testing even though you are not enrolled in Penn Cares Testing; you may ignore these emails.

Red PennOpen Pass? If you signed up for Penn Cares testing but are not scheduled for a weekly test, you may get a red PennOpen pass. You will need to schedule your weekly test in order to be given a green pass. If you are no longer coming to campus weekly or have switched to COVID SAFE,

please email Judy Jackson, <u>jajackso@pennmedicine.upenn.edu</u> to arrange to be un-enrolled from Penn Cares. Please refer to Perelman School of Medicine email of 1/25/21 4:24pm for more details about testing.

Vaccinations. Penn does not yet have a general scheduling process for vaccinations. Medical students are being scheduled for vaccinations through UPHS. PhD students who work in labs connected to clinical facilities, such as CHOP, VET, or UPHS, may be scheduled for vaccinations through those entities. Students who are working SARS-CoV-2 in BSL3 labs or processing specimens from COVID patients may be prioritized for vaccination through Penn Medicine regardless of lab location (contact your PI and/or departmental BA, or Judy Jackson in BGS if in a non-PSOM lab). Subsequent prioritization groups will follow state quidelines and will occur as quickly as possible, depending upon availability of vaccine doses, which remains fluid and difficult to predict. You may be able to schedule an appointment through one of the <u>local lists</u>. We will continue to share updates as we receive them from our University and Health System colleagues. We ask that our students be patient and understanding as we navigate this process as a community. The institutions are doing their best to vaccinate the exposed and vulnerable first. Ultimately, we want to vaccinate everyone, so if you are offered the opportunity to get vaccinated and want to do so, we ask that you get vaccinated. Every individual who is vaccinated is one less person who can spread the disease. This will allow more efficient distribution to the whole community if we don't have to circle back for people who deferred. We thank you for all your efforts to keep our community safe during these challenging times.

Prism & MATLAB Licenses

BGS students may obtain one year licenses for Prism free of charge. The sign-up form for Prism is included below. Note that the **form is due by March 31**st, **2021**. Information on obtaining MATLAB licenses is also provided below.

1) **PRISM** LICENSES

These are arranged through BGS. The new license year begins May 1st. Please note that even if you already have a Prism license you need to sign up again.

Note that BGS offers Prism particularly for its graphing capabilities. With respect to statistical applications, we remind students of the importance of understanding the fundamental properties of any statistical analyses that they undertake. In addition, principles of reproducible research require all analyses to be carefully documented. This involves storing the data in an accessible form and creating a written record so that another researcher can easily replicate the statistical analyses for a particular set of data.

2) MATLAB LICENSES

These are arranged through Penn's Office of Software Licensing (OSL). You should email licenses@upenn.edu using your Penn email address and include the following information:

HostID, operating system, and computer user name. See the following <u>instructions</u> for help locating this information.

Please note that the current MATLAB license expires **August 31, 2021** and you will need to contact OSL again at that time in order to renew.

CTL Graduate Fellowship nominations

Deadline: Noon, Friday, March 26

This Fellowship honors graduate students who are dedicated to excellent teaching and is designed to foster conversations about teaching to help graduate students develop as teachers. Fellows participate in regular teaching discussions with the other Graduate Fellows, organize departmental and university-wide teaching workshops for graduate students, and mentor other graduate students in teaching, consulting with and observing current teaching assistants as demand arises. Fellows receive \$6,000 award for the school year. Candidates must be nominated by their department. See the Center for Teaching & Learning (CTL) website for more details.

GAPSA's Pilot Transcription Fund

Over the past year, GAPSA has identified qualitative students are currently underserved, required to manually transcribe their own interviews or outsource transcription services on their own dime for the vast hours of interviews and audio recordings.

Asking qualitative students to manually transcribe or to pay for transcription services highlights a lack of support for qualitative students; computational students are provided with access to clusters to perform research much like chemistry students do not need to purchase their own raw materials for research.

GAPSA seeks to provide temporarily relief for these students while building a case to present to the administration to address this need.
