QUICK TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- 1. **Ask** the person who invited you to teach, colleagues, and/or educational leaders **for contextual factors.**
- What are the goals and objectives?
- Who are the learners?
- What do they already know or know how to do?

2. **Tailor** your teaching for contextual factors.

3. **Deliver** with enthusiasm for learners, teaching, and content!
